### Funding Opportunities

#### Loan Sharks Cash Available for Residents in Yorkshire & Humberside

The Illegal Money Lending Team, who investigate and prosecute loan sharks, are putting forward multiple pots of £5000 of Proceeds of Crime Money to help subsidise community projects that assist in raising awareness of loan sharks.

Local residents, charities, community and voluntary groups, schools and statutory agencies in the Yorkshire & Humberside area are welcome to apply for the cash, to spend on any worthwhile community project which does at least one of the following:

- Contributes to raising the awareness of the dangers of using 'loan sharks'
- Promotes professional credit options to people at risk of using 'loan sharks'
- Promotes financial management or budgeting to people at risk of using 'loan sharks'

- Reduces crime, disorder and illegal money lending in the local area.

### **Heritage Lottery Fund Workshops for New Grants Programme**

In two weeks, the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) will open its new Kick the Dust grants programme which is intended to support ambitious youth-focused projects that transform how heritage organisations engage with young people (aged 11 to 25 years). Grants of between £500,000 and £1 million for projects that take between three to five years to complete will be available to consortia of three or more organisations, including heritage and youth organisations. The funding is intended to:

- Make heritage relevant to more and a greater diversity of young people, building on their needs and interests.
- Increase the ambition, scale and quality of youth engagement with heritage.
- Develop and embed sustainable, ongoing work with young people within heritage organisations.
- Evidence the value of youth engagement with heritage.

Projects will also need to meet at least one of the HLF outcomes for heritage, for people and for communities. The guidelines will be published on the HLF [website](#) on 23 September 2016. There will be a mandatory project enquiry stage followed by an application process in two rounds:

- The deadline for project enquiries will be 2 December 2016.
- The deadline for first-round applications will be 20 February 2017.

### **Nuffield Foundation's Children and Families Grant Programme - October Deadline Reminder**

The Nuffield Foundation's Children and Families programme funds projects to help ensure that social policy and the institutions governing family life in the UK are best adapted to meet the needs of children and families. The Foundation is currently accepting outline applications until 1 October 2016.

Charitable or non-profit making (including research institutes and universities) based in the UK can apply for grants to support research in the following areas: Child Welfare and Development, Early Years Education and Childcare, Child Protection

Grants normally range in size from £10,000 up to £350,000, with most lying between £50,000 and £200,000.

The Foundation also considers larger grants but these are exceptional and often take longer to process. It also occasionally makes smaller grants for pilots or research and development work that may cost less than £10,000. Most projects funded are under four years in duration. The deadline for outline applications is 10 October 2016.

## Community Transport Minibus Fund Opens for Round 2

The Department for Transport has launched a second round of the £25 million Community Minibus Fund which is being administered by the Community Transport Association, the membership association for community bus operators across the UK, who will provide advice to all bidders.

The Department for Transport created the £25 million Community Transport Minibus Fund in 2014 with the purpose of supplying new minibuses to not-for-profit community transport operators in England. The first round of funding saw more than 300 charities and community groups receive minibuses.

To be eligible for a minibus, applicants must:

- Be an established organisation using a recognised not-for-profit legal form, such as a charitable incorporated organisation, charitable company (limited by guarantee) or community interest company, and able to demonstrate that they are running a service to benefit the community.
- Be a registered charity or other not-for-profit entity.
- Have a Section 19 permit.
- Use the vehicle provided for voluntary services only and not to compete for tendered contracts let by public sector bodies.
- Ensure that the money paid to their organisation by public sector bodies does not exceed the de minimis State Aid limit (€200,000, approximately £160,000) in a rolling three-year period.

The following organisations will be favourable scored:

- Educational organisations that provide a role in education outside of traditional 'classroom learning, such as activity centres for disabled young people, or organisations who support adult learning etc.
- Organisations serving rural areas.

The Government will award one minibus per organisation, and organisations that were successful in round one may not apply for this round.

The application deadline is 2 December 2016 (5pm).
