

It was announced last week the future national roll-out of Universal Credit Full Service for 2017 and 2018. This is where anyone wishing to claim any one of the six benefits Universal Credit (UC) replaces, will now have to claim UC if their postcode is within the relevant local authority area. The full document runs to 25 pages and the link is below if anyone wants to look at the full roll out.

December 2017 – North East Lincolnshire Council

February 2018 – Scarborough Borough Council

February 2018 - Selby District Council

April 2018 – East Riding of Yorkshire Council

September 2018 – Hull City Council

At present, we already have Harrogate Borough Council, Richmondshire District Council, Ryedale District Council, Craven District Council and Hambleton District Council live on UC Full Service.
